This Gen 5 Gatehouse needed the new Gen 8 architectural elements and the InnFusion 2 Décor FF&E package. Vibrant contemporary furniture pieces are grouped to form distinct areas for dining, relaxing, meeting and socializing. With new 3D decorative wall surfaces and recessed accent lighting, the new built-in, flat-screen TV wall makes a strong visual statement. The 10-seat communal table offers a great setting for casual meetings, with built-in power and data. The original buffet line located in the Hearth Room dominated one entire wall, so the line was relocated into what was a meeting room. The buffet can now be separated from the Hearth Room with two new decorative sliding glass and wood "barn" doors. The new buffet cabinetry is designed as free-standing cabinetry. Existing traditional wall sconces and ceiling fans were replaced with up-to-date fixtures. The traditional woodwork was replaced with simple, clean lined trim.

This new "interior" design is not just limited to the inside. A fire pit and grill patio area were added to create a dramatic "Outdoor Experience" just off the Gatehouse near the pool. They are both clad in stacked stone veneer with stained concrete tops. New rattan seating invites the guest to relax.
